**MORMON STATION HOSTS 100TH ANNIVERSARY FIRE PREVENTION EVENT**

On Saturday, June 26, from 10 a.m. to noon, Mormon Station State Historic Park will host a free public program focusing on fire prevention.

100 years ago, on June 28, 1910, much of Genoa's business district and a few homes were engulfed by a fire started by an inmate trying to get rid of bedbugs with a pan of burning sulphur.

East Fork Fire District's fire prevention trailer will be onsite for people to learn about fire prevention along with antique fire engines and other equipment around the park. The US Forest Service's Smokey Bear and the local Fire Safe Council will be at the park with representatives and equipment. The Nevada Division of Forestry may drop in with their helicopter — weather and fire danger permitting.

There will be food and lectures, and visitors can tour the Genoa Courthouse Museum and Mormon Station State Park Museum and see photos and learn more history of the 1910 Genoa fire.
