According to the Nevada Department of Wildlife (NDOW) the number of bear complaints has risen sharply in the last ten years, partly due to the increase of people living in bear habitat.

As a resident living in bear habitat, you are responsible for proper storage of trash and pet/horse feed. NDOW had to kill 20 nuisance bears in 2010 due in part to poor storage of trash. You are also encouraged to remove ripened fruit from your trees before bears become conditioned to eating it in your yard. Bear-resistant trash cans can be purchased either through Bear Box,
