Lillian Virgin Finnegan was the originator of making candy for Genoa in 1919 as an effort to raise money to purchase streetlights for Genoa. With the help of her aunt, Jane Raycraft Campbell, and many other volunteers, delicious candy samples were made and given out at a midnight fundraising supper held in the Raycraft Hotel.

The tradition continues and now volunteers donate hundreds of hours to make thousands of pounds of candy which is then sold at the annual Candy Dance event, scheduled for Sept. 28-29.
